Spencer Ratliff (http://www.oldnorthdesigns.com/) gave us a tour of Able Trade Workshop and Studios (https://weareabletrade.com/). This is a unique membership based fully equipped wood shop and metal shop. The space is very impressive and they have lots of great equipment. Lou Mansur gave us a tour of his shop which is also very well equipped and makes great use of space. Hal Galbraith invited us into his shop which he built and very recently completed. It was a very enviable space with a foundation of years of experience. Another shop that was built by the maker was Scott Dewaard's shop.
